A note from the Chairman of Beeley Parish Council

I am very pleased to report that the Council is now back up to its full complement: the Councillors are myself, Rosalyn Stewart, Siobhan Spencer, Chris Hornsby and Bob Damarell. All contact details are on the next page.

Localism is hot on the agenda and Local Government is changing to reflect this. All Council meetings are open to the public and we would love to see you at the meetings. However we will now also hold an Annual Parish Meeting. This is a meeting of the parish and not the Parish Council. Any registered local government elector is entitled to speak and vote. Other members of the public (and press) can be present but cannot participate in the meeting. Minutes will be taken and kept in a separate book to parish council meetings and approved and signed at the next annual parish meeting. I will give a report on the work of the Council including the setting of the precept. The meeting also provides an opportunity to invite a speaker on some subject relevant to the parish and for the public to raise any matters they wish. We won't have a speaker this year but will take suggestions for next year. The meeting will be 21st May 2012 at 7pm

I am pleased to report that we now have a light in the bus shelter which will make waiting in there in the dark much nicer. It is a solar powered light which is on low light until someone walks into the shelter. If you notice any problem with the light please report it to the Parish Clerk.

There have been a number of planning applications in the village recently. The Parish Council is consulted by the Peak Park on every application. If you have particular issues or comments with any application please come to the Council meeting to discuss it.

If there is anything you would like to see in the Village or changed in the Village please let me, one of the other Councillors, or Sarah, know. We would love to see any of you at a Council meeting – you are always welcome.

St Anne's Church, Beeley

The Church is keen to hear from you on suggestions to make the Church more accessible for you – Are services advertised enough? Are the services at the right time? Should there be a children's/family service? Is it warm enough? Please let the vicar (David Garnett 01246 582130), Vernon Mather (01629 732317), Judith Fraser-Martin or Sarah Porter know.

Also the project to add a toilet to the Church is going to take longer than first envisaged. Although now all the approvals are in place, the build cost has come in very high and so some further fundraising is required. The PCC is currently looking in to potential grants.

Illegal tree works to protected trees

Since the increase in energy prices, there has been a distinct increase in illegal tree work in the National Park as a source of firewood. Some illegal tree work has been carried out within village Conservation Areas. Trees are protected in many ways. They can be protected by Tree Preservation Orders, Conservation Areas, Planning Conditions and the Wildlife and Countryside Act so we would recommend people always to check with the tree team at the Peak Park before carrying out any tree works. Much of the work carried out would not have been objected to by the National Park Tree Conservation Officers and would have been supported. There could have been grant aid towards good tree care but, sadly, important and attractive trees that add to the quality of all our lives have been disfigured, or sometimes completely lost. The tree team in the National Park's Environment and Economy Service endeavour to operate a pragmatic customer focused service. Their objective is to encourage good tree management and care. Their aim is to retain important trees in our villages with minimum fuss and maximum encouragement. The National Park Authority tree team can be contacted on 01629 816200. The advice and service is free and impartial, and no query is too small.
